2.1 Stable release

To install Dar, run this command in your terminal:

```
$ pip install dar
```

This is the preferred method to install Dar, as it will always install the most recent stable release.

If you don't have [pip](#) installed, this [Python installation guide](#) can guide you through the process.

2.2 From sources

The sources for Dar can be downloaded from the [Github repo](#).

You can either clone the public repository:

```
$ git clone git://github.com/alanbato/dar
```

Or download the [tarball](#):

```
$ curl -OL https://github.com/alanbato/dar/tarball/master
```

Once you have a copy of the source, you can install it with:

```
$ python setup.py install
```
